Know Your Turner

Larry Slief, an extraordinary Top Turner started his long and illustrious turning career while living in Pittsburgh, PA in 1946 with a homemade lathe. He took a 1750 rpm motor, attached a Jacobs chuck to the motor shaft, made a tail stock with a bolt using two jam nuts for adjusting and started turning. He said he made a lot more chips than turnings, but he was having fun.

His family tried to make a farmer out of him as he was growing up. His dad had passed away at an early age and his mother and uncle was trying to make a go of it. Larry said that he had plowed all day one time with a four-bottom plow pulled by a John Deere tractor. After stopping about sundown, he looked around at what he had accomplished for the day. It didn't look like much to him, and he decided that farming was not for him.

So, he applied to and was accepted at Kansas State University. He majored in Electrical Engineering and while there he got some lessons in life. He lived in private homes for cheap rent, worked at the collage cafeteria so he could get his meals, and once a week mailed a package home to his mother - his laundry. She would do it up for him and mail it back.

In order to get money he joined the Army ROTC, which paid \$27.00 a month and furnished uniforms. Larry said that the girls liked those spiffy uniforms. At graduation he was commissioned 2^{nd} Lt and was assigned to a battery of artillery searchlights. He served just under five years in active service, was discharged, transferred to active reserve and finally retired after 21 years as a Lt Col. Not bad for a Kansas farm boy!

In 1944 Larry married his beloved Ruby and for 57 years they shared each other's lives. Not blessed with children, they still had each other.

He finally got a real lathe. He bought a Shop Smith in 1954. He said he got it mostly for the 9-inch table saw. However, he got in some turning time also. This was about the time he started turning tops. He was standing in front of the lathe with a small block of wood in his hands wondering what he was going to do with it. The image of a top came to mind, and as they say, the rest is history. He had trouble coming up with a proper tip. Turning a wooden one didn't last and nails put a hole in the linoleum floor. Ruby didn't like that in the least. He wound up using a ¹/₄" steel rod with the end filed into a ball shape. He had so much fun making tops, it developed into his specialty.

He now has a 1940 vintage Delta that has a good story behind it. Ask him about it. It turns tops, also. Larry is one of those good solid persons. He retired from OG&E after 31 years, bought a home in 1973 that he still lives in, is a charter member of COWA, is always working and doing for the turners club. He has a lot of knowledge and talent he is always ready to share. You should take the time to just sit down and talk to a real piece of history. It's fun!
